Winemaker notes

The 2011 Gran Reserva Cabernet Sauvignon is a blend of 19 different lots from the different areas within the Maipo Valley of Chile and 3% Cabernet Sauvignon from the Alto Cachapoal and 4% the Aconcagua Valley. The final blend has 88% Cabernet Sauvignon, 6% Merlot and 6% Syrah. The wines was aged in French and American oak barreles for 12 months prior to blending and cold settled and filter but not fined prior to bottling.

Aging Potential: 15 years.

Tasting Notes

Colour: Deep Reddish Purple.

Aroma: Plum and blackberry notes dried berries and cherry licorice.

Flavours: Classic Maipo flavors of black fruit and dried apricots and black cherry with tobacco notes. Long finish with licorice berry and spicy cherry notes with sweet tannins and balanced acidity and will age nicely in the bottle for added complexity.
